What do you like most about the neighborhood?  
 My wife and I were drawn to the neighborhood's close proximity to Center City and the Chinatown neighborhood. I love that the neighborhood both embraces it's industrial history and it's progressive future. The community arts initiatives and music scene create a hip and vibrant neighborhood. I am excited for the opening of the rail park and hope that it serves as a model for the rest of the city.

What do you think needs improvement in the neighborhood?  
 Cohesive vision and mission between the multiple neighborhood stakeholders to ensure Callowhill does not lose the characteristics that make it unique. More street lights to increase safety throughout, especially under the viaduct and around the power station. It does not create a welcoming gateway between CC and the northern end of the neighborhood. Increase visible neighborhood watch efforts to decrease petty crime and vagrants in the neighborhood. I would also like to see increase in programming that brings the community together in and out of their homes.

Tell us a little about yourself—how long have you lived in the neighborhood and why would you make a good board member:  
 I am a Commercial Property Manager with Keystone Property Group, currently managing the iconic GSB building in Bala Cynwyd, with the goal of managing high rises in Center City. The city is my home. My wife and I grew out of our Chinatown condo and began house hunting after getting married this past April. One of the few rowhomes in the neighborhood came up for sale and we immediately fell in love with the home and neighborhood. We bought the house in August 2016 and started renovations.
